HOW THE BIBLE CAME TO BE: a historical study- How did the sixty-six books that we call “the Bible” actually come to be? Who decided what was to be included in the Bible, and what was to be excluded? Why were certain books omitted? Who wrote the books of the New Testament and when? How and why did we get so many different translations of the Bible? These are just a few of the questions that historian Bob Scheina will answer during his four-week study on the mechanical construction of the Bible.
